Sparkle Rewards



What do you think about our rewards?

The responses to our survey were very informative and have raised discussion in school. There is some lack of clarity of how Sparkle Points and Sparkle Time can be earned. We have reviewed this and discussed this with the children and also added it to the ongoing review of the Behaviour Ethos policy.

Sparkle time is earned by keeping the Sparkle Charter.

Sparkle points are earned by going *above and beyond* the learning expectations.

Values tokens can only be given by another child. This helps children learn how to live out our values and recognise it in the behaviour of others.

Children love Sparkle Time and meeting different children. Some would like different activities added such as art or gymnastics.

The rewards the children love receiving most are certificates they can take home and Sparkle Time. Most prefer to be rewarded in class by either the Headteacher or the Class teacher.

We are now reviewing the Sparkle Charter with the children and adults to ensure agreement and understanding.

With half term coming up, please remember to order lunches in advance for the first day back 21st February.


